11:00 a.m. – Kindergarten Children go directly to their classroom (Room #11). Children (Grade 1 to Grade 5) participate in first 10 minutes of worship service upstairs.

11:10 a.m. – Sunday School Teachers take children downstairs to their respective classrooms.

12:10 p.m. – Sunday School concludes – Children K to Grade 5 taken to Large Vestry for dismissal and sign-out by parent/guardian.

1. As you know we helped Brenda and children repatriate to Liberia just before Christmas. Things are different in Liberia even from Ghana. We are having more difficulty communicating with Brenda there – one reason phone access and another due to lack of electricity. In Ghana, electricity was available most of the time – so Brenda could go to an Internet café and email us. There are Internet access places in Gbanga, Liberia too but since electricity is not readily available, emails are expensive (\$5 US/ email) as they have to run a generator to get the electricity. Brenda has been able to enrol the children in a school near where she is staying (not the Lutheran school we had at first thought) and she remains with the people she travelled with from Ghana at present.

2. Both Estella Brown (Gifty and Moses) and Kpazay Tarr (Wilma) have applied for Canadian Citizenship in the fall 2009. As this process takes a year or so, they are waiting for the Citizenship Information the government will send for them to study prior to taking a test. We hope Immigration issues and applications will become simpler for other family members to come to Canada once they are all Canadian citizens rather than permanent residents.
